Coincidentally, the Queensland Government's new 50-cent public transport program also recently came into effect. This program sees all public transport trips cost only 50 cents regardless of where you get on or how far you travel. With the chill of winter now behind us, I think this is a great opportunity to explore places further away from our homes.

Consider asking a neighbour if they'd like to join you on a 50-cent trip to somewhere you've never been before – just be sure to read the route schedule so you know how to get home! I think of how this



offer may benefit our older neighbours in particular, who are more likely to experience social isolation, particularly if they live alone.

As standard, we have plenty of events scheduled for the next 3 months, including several Resident Engagement Meetings (REMs). A REM is a great opportunity for you and your community to discuss matters that are important to you face-to-face with staff. Remember, you can attend a REM if you live in the region where it is being held, even if you don't live at the site it's being hosted at.

I wish you all the best for the rest of spring as we all eagerly prepare for the holiday season.


LABRADOR

Sprout into spring!

The start of spring is the perfect opportunity to plant the seeds that will help you level up your gardens – pun intended!

We've put together a whole bunch of tips for seasoned and budding green thumbs alike.



Grow to save

Have you ever thought about how growing your own produce could help you save on your grocery bill?

Whether you have a community garden, big yard, balcony or just a sunny windowsill, growing herbs, fruit and veggies is not only a great hobby, but can help you reduce how much you're spending on fresh produce at the supermarket.

Some of the easiest things to grow at home are:



Lettuce

Place leftover lettuce stems in a bowl with a small amount of water


in the bottom. Keep it somewhere that gets good sunlight and mist regularly. After 4 days, roots will begin to appear, meaning you can transfer the lettuce to soil.



Tomatoes

Rinse the tomato seeds and allow them to dry. Plant in potting soil until you notice

them start to grow. Allow the seedlings to get a few inches high before transferring them outdoors. During cold weather you can grow your tomatoes indoors, just remember to keep them in an area that gets plenty of sunlight and water a few times each week.



Potatoes

For this you'll need potato peelings that have eyes on them.

Cut those peelings into 2-inch pieces, ensuring there are at least two or three eyes on each piece. Allow them to dry out overnight and then simply plant them about four inches deep in your soil. Make sure the eyes are facing up when planting. After a few weeks you'll see the potato plant begin to grow.



Herbs

Grow herbs like basil, oregano, parsley, rosemary, mint, chives and coriander from seeds in about 7 weeks.

Simply use fresh potting soil in a smaller container, sprinkle seeds and lightly cover with more soil. Water them down well and cover with cling wrap to keep moisture inside and promote germination.



What about a worm farm?

Worm farms are a great way to turn food scraps into rich fertiliser for your garden.

Almost half of all household waste is organic and therefore ideal for composting, yet so many of us throw food scraps in the bin instead of composting them.

Recycling your organic waste with a worm farm is good for both the environment and your garden, so why not explore if your community can get a worm farm up and running with the help of our Community Engagement team?

We can work with you to find a suitable place in your community for a worm farm that is easily accessible and doesn't cause nuisance for any other residents. If your community doesn't have a social club or the ability to purchase or make worm farm equipment, we can explore if there are any local grants we can apply for together. Check out the working bee our Coolamon Apartments community had to start their worm farm (photos above).

For those of you preferring something smaller in scale, check out this blog post about how to set-up a worm farm on a balcony:



What to feed your worms:

- Leftover kitchen scraps including fruit and vegetable peelings. Go light on citrus and if you add anything meaty, be sure to bury it to avoid odours.
- Cardboard and paper. Remove any plastic windows or tape before adding. Items like shredded newspaper, paper egg cartons, office paper, or takeaway boxes. Soak these in water and then drain before adding to the worm farm.
- Coffee grounds and loose tea or tea bags.
- · Crushed eggshells.

Use what the worms produce as fertiliser for your garden and watch it flourish!



Report maintenance

Please don't wait for an inspection to report maintenance.

Many people like to perform a big 'spring clean' during the new season and may come across items that need maintenance or repairs.

It's best practice to report maintenance to us as soon as you identify it, whether it's routine or emergency.

Our timeframes for actioning maintenance requests are:

Routine repairs

14-day response

Maintenance that does not prevent regular use of the property.

Priority repairs

24-hour response

A fault or damage that causes serious inconvenience to the tenant.

Urgent repairs

4-hour response

A fault or damage that endangers health and safety or could result in extensive damage to the property.

Emergency repairs

1-hour response

A fault or damage that could lead to death or injury of persons, or serious damage to the property.


Spirit of community at Mitchelton



spare change: 50c public transport

For 6 months from **5 August 2024**, all Translink public transport services across Queensland cost just **50 cents per journey**, no matter where you start or how far you go.

This great initiative by the Queensland Government will not only help bust congestion on our roads, but it's a great opportunity to explore where you live. Have you considered asking a neighbour if they'd like to go on a day trip with you?

UPCOMING STATE ELECTION

A Queensland state election will be held on **Saturday 26 October 2024**. If you've changed address since the previous state election in 2020, it's important to ensure your enrolment details are up-to-date! You can do this by checking the Australian Electoral Commission website at check.aec.gov.au.

Remember, voting is compulsory in Australia and those who don't have a valid reason for not voting may be fined – unpaid fines may then be handed off to SPER. Most schools and some churches and community centres will act as voting booths. You may also be able to pre-poll before election day.

If you're unsure what State Government electorate your address is in or how to vote, visit ecq.qld.gov.au.
